Reunion Update

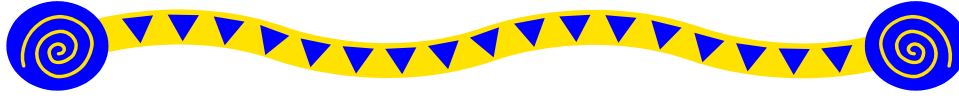
A recent analysis of where ALTD is at with Reunion Groups...collectively...presented us with some alarming results. We found that a majority of our community who attended their first weekend prior to 2009, at one point or another, actively participated in a Reunion Group for a rather lengthy amount of time. And a number of those people are still involved in a group.

However since that time, **participation by "new" Pescadores has dropped off dramatically.** Granted, times have changed a bit since 2009, but very few of these men and women ever even attempted to join a group. We have cited a number of contributing factors, but in the end, despite the emphasis given to them during each weekend, these folks have chosen not to give priority to joining a group. This is not where the 4th Day is supposed to go! Some might point out that they're part of a larger Facebook reunion group, but there's no face-to-face intimacy involved in a small group setting, which are elements that are central to the fulfillment and success of being in a Reunion Group.

With the Men's and Women's Weekends upon us, I would like to call out to the Sponsors to specifically talk with their Candidates about the importance of being in a 4th Day Group and then follow-up very shortly thereafter to see if any progress was being made.

We'd also like to see if any of the "old guard" would like to step up and mentor a new group for 6-12 months until the group could stand on their own. You can certainly call upon me to try and assist where I can.

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Inspiration to fully LIVE our Fourth Day – from Pastor Ryan

1 Peter 4:8 tells us to LOVE DEEPLY. What does that mean to you?

We all know that Christians ought to love one another, which implies an affection to people (especially those close to you) and a hearty endeavor to promote this way of Life as a follower of Christ. This mutual affection should be fervent, sincere, strong, and lasting. Col. 3:14 says it is greater than faith or hope and that it will cover a multitude of sins. Matthew Henry points out that "there is a special relation between all sincere Christians which requires special affection. It is not enough for Christians not to bear malice, nor to have common respect for one another, they must intensely and fervently love each other. It inclines people to forgive and forget offences against themselves, to cover and conceal the sins of others, rather than aggravate them and spread them abroad." So consider what this means to those closest to you.

I have a wonderful life with a wonderful Godly wife and 4 great kids... I grew up with one of the best parents a kid could have, as most of you have heard in my rollos... And I have had the privilege of being in the ministry most of my life and being equipped with some excellent tools that prepared me to be a father, spouse, and friend. That said, here are some things I can share on how to Love Deeply... with your kids, spouse and others.

1. Put down the iPhone and play.

One of the hardest parts of being a human in the digital age is our complete saturation into our phones and other devices. My iPhone may be one of the best and worst things in my life. I have heard the relationship between people and their phones described as if it was an affair... and I don't think that is far off. As much as I love my phone there is a time to turn it off and play... I'm preaching to myself as well when I say this: put down the phone for a while.

2. Be patient & be generous with your time

I always struggle with this... in fact I may be the most impatient person you have ever met... so this one is really hard for me, but I have learned the lesson well... slow down, listen, and strategically plan your time with your children, spouse and friends... and while doing all of this be patient. Kids don't operate in our culture's ultra "fast food" world yet... and they don't want to, or understand why we do. When you get too rushed you communicate a lot of things to them that probably aren't good. Your kids (and your spouse and your friends) need quality time, the best time you have to offer, possibly more than anything else you have to offer. We always hear this, but you can't get these years back... And if you have lots of kids make sure you invest in alone time with each one of them individually on a regular basis.

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3. Take time to be affectionate with God, good friends, your spouse, your children and yourself

It is so easy to not spend valuable time with others when kids enter the picture. As your time with others may decrease I encourage you to maximize the quality of that time. First spend individual time with God, and time with God and your spouse... and BE COMMITTED to this. Next find friends that you can be immersed with who share your life patterns. I can't count how many people I know who no longer have "BEST FRIENDS" after life with kids, and it's unfortunate... we need GREAT FRIENDS... (and it's Biblical!) Your spouse needs you, we need to give each other intimacy, adventure, love, and the best of everything that we have to offer... and finally yourself... find something you like and take time to do it... alone... Discover the love languages and spend time finding out what people need and desire as well as what God is asking of you... specifically.
